#### **REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF AUGUST 2022**

**VISITS:** During the month 8 visits were made to the member estates in connection with Advisory, training and experimental purpose.

WEATHER: Continuity of rainfall after July was there till 12th of August 2022. The rain comes to halt and intermittent rains were registered till 23rd of August and again the intensity of rainfall increased from 23rd August to 31st August 2022. Splashing rains pounding for more than twelve days picks up pace in both the taluks of Nilgiri-Wayanad. The incessant and torrential rains triggered landslides in few places and floods in many places during the month. Power supply was disrupted as the trees fell on many places and electric towers and poles have fallen. Roads connectivity in too many villages is lost due to collapses of minor bridges, damages of culverts, blocks in drainages and uprooting of trees. The highest rain recorded was 636.8mm from 8th to 12th August 2022 for 6 days. The month August the weather was humid, cloudy, with low temperature and lack of sunshine hours which greatly hindered the crop promotions during the month. The total rainfall for the month of August 2022 was 988.4 mm with 24 wet days whereas, for the same corresponding month of last year it was 267.0 mm with 21 wet days and 549.5mm for the decennial average. The highest rainfall registered in August for the past one decade was 1304.0 mm during the year 2019 followed by 1134.8 mm during 2020. The minimum temperature fluctuated between 15.0 °C to 18 °C and the maximum temperature oscillated between 20.0 °C to 29.0 <sup>o</sup>C. The lowest relative humidity levels was 64 per cent and the highest registered was 100 per cent. The details of rainfall, temperature and relative humidity recorded for the month and decennial average in the regional centre, Gudalur are given in the following tables No.1 & 2.
